[Course aims]

The home use of drugs with major side effects, such as anticancer drugs, narcotic analgesics, and interferons, has been increasing alongside the progress in home treatment. Thus, we will cover the pharmacological effects, the side effects, the perspectives, and the problems for the self-management of these drugs and discuss supporting the promotion of adherence.
