[Course aims]

Psychosomatic dentistry is the field that solves medically unexplained oral symptoms (MUOS). MUOS is those that complain of symptoms without any clear dental or medical cause, and psychosocial factors are involved in the manifestation of symptoms. The purpose of this course is to understand approaches to patients who complain of MUOS.

[Course objectives]

- (1) Explain what psychosomatic dentistry is.
- (2) Explain what oral symptoms are difficult to explain medically.
- (3) Explain the diagnosis of patients complaining of MUOS.
- (4) Explain therapeutic approaches for patients complaining of MUOS.
