[Course aims]

In this course, graduate students will be trained to acquire the ability to deal with systemic complications encountered during dental treatment. To achieve these objectives, students are guided on how to perform sedative procedures and administer general anesthesia to patients, and learn the basic skills required to manage the airway, respiration, and the circulation.

[Course objectives]

The goal of this course are for students to be able to:

- (1) Perform intravenous catheter placement.
- (2) Perform a preoperative evaluation.
- (3) Perform intravenous sedative procedures.
- (4) Administer general anesthesia to ASA performance status 1-2 patients under the guidance of a dental anesthesia specialist.
- (5) Attend a resuscitation course and train in ACLS skills.
- (6) Perform clinical research in the field of dental anesthesiology.
